NOTICE TO ALL FIRST (2019/2020 COHORT), SECOND AND THIRD YEAR STUDENTS

SUBJECT: END OF JANUARY-APRIL 2020 SEMESTER EXAMINATIONS

The Ministry of Education in its communique on Tuesday, 29th September 2020 allowed for phased reopening of Universities and tertiary institutions. The Ministry was categorical that the reopening shall be in strict adherence to the health guidelines set by the Ministry of Health to combat COVID 19 pandemic.

Following the above communication, the University Senate during its 59th meeting held on 6th October 2020 approved physical sitting of end of January-April 2020 semester examinations for continuing students.

To ensure adherence to Covid 19 protocols, the examinations shall be staggered as follows;

2.	i. Second year Undergraduate Students ii. Second year Diploma Students	Monday, 2nd November 2020 – Friday, 06th November, 2020
3.	i. First year Undergraduate Students(2019/2020 cohort) ii. First year Diploma Students (2019/2020 cohort)	Monday, 9th November – Friday, 13th November, 2020



NOTE: Postgraduate and Finalist students sitting for re-sits and special examinations shall be required to come to the University. However, their examinations shall be offered online.

Examination timetables shall be available on the university website: www.mut.ac.ke.

You are advised to make accommodation arrangements for the dates you shall be sitting for examinations. Off campus accommodation can now be booked online via a link available on the University website.

The University has put in place measures to ensure prevention of spread of Covid 19. These measures include recording of temperature, provision of hands-free hand washing equipment around the University, creating distancing in lecture halls, hostels, laboratories and cafeteria and preparing of the University Health unit to cater for emergency cases.

Students are expected to strictly adhere to the guidelines put in place and non-adherence shall not be accepted. These guidelines include;

- i. Proper wearing of face masks at all times,
- ii. Frequent hand washing with soap and running water for 20-30 seconds,
- iii. Observe respiratory etiquette (use the elbow while coughing or a disposable tissue),
- iv. Maintaining a social distancing of 1 – 1.5 meters
- v. Seek treatment promptly when you feel unwell.
